Thank you everyone for such a great July! Here comes the start of school and a super August! Good luck everyone on your first days of school next week.



#### Scoutmaster Interview: August 2025



#### Rank: Eagle Scout

It is with great appreciate for his leadership, participation, and eagerness to help our scouts succeed that we honored our Scoutmaster, Mr. Trey this past month with a trophy and card. To also honor him we wanted to interview him and create a get to know our Scoutmaster Mr. Trey article. He was great at answering questions and kept us laughing while we listened to him talk about his scouting experiences.



A: I have been a Scoutmaster about a year and a half. I was an assistant scoutmaster for 3 years before that.

Q: What motivated you to become a Scoutmaster?

Q: How many merit badges did you complete?

A: I completed 66 merit badges!
